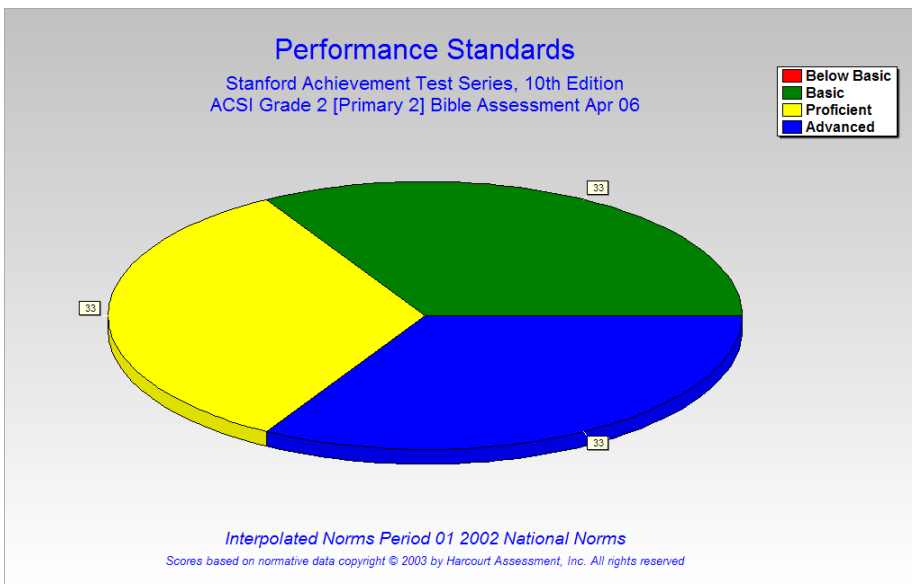
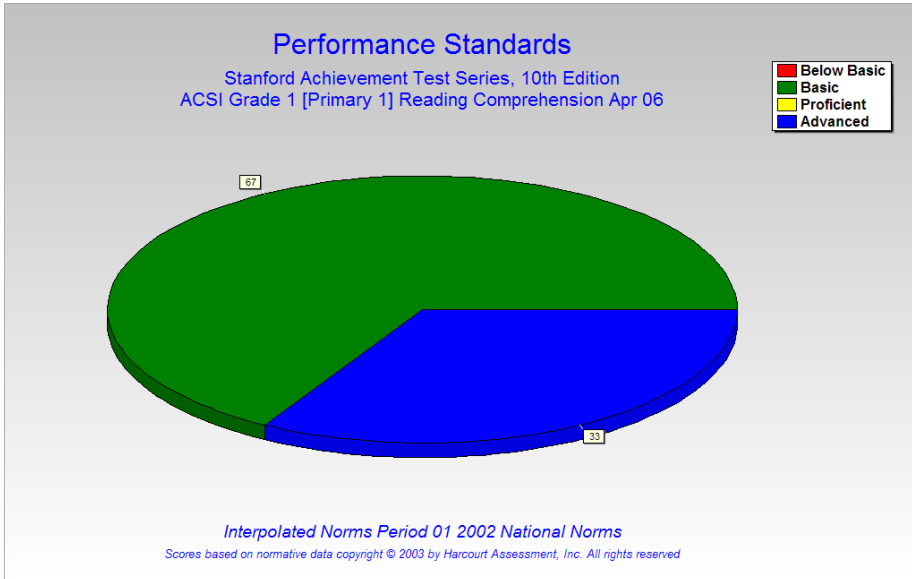


WHY SHOULD YOU CONSIDER NCS FOR YOUR CHILD?

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the mission of NCS? Our purpose is to provide a first class learning environment that is marked by academic excellence, athletic programs, extracurricular activities, and a strong commitment to Biblical teaching.

What is the status of Accreditation at NCS?

We are currently seeking accreditation by ACSI (Association of Christian Schools International) and then by SACS (Southern Association of Colleges and Schools)

How many grades? We have K4-12 grades.

How many counties does NCS serve?

We have a diverse student body that resides in NC and VA: Warren, Vance, Granville, and Halifax (NC), and Mecklenburg (VA)

How many churches are represented among the student body at NCS?

We have students from 45 different churches representing various denominations.

What is the winning element of NCS? Our teachers make the difference. We have teachers who are trained in their fields and have years of experience in the classrooms. Each teacher takes the time and opportunity to speak to the students.

What curriculum is used at NCS?

We use the A Beka curriculum supplemented with Bob Jones Curriculum, McDougall Littell, Quest Bible Series and other materials through ACSI.

What is the Scope and Sequence for the different grades at NCS?

Elementary Grades - K-4, K-5: We use the A Beka curriculum supplemented by other materials that provide a strong foundation in the early years. The kindergarten program emphasizes phonics, reading, cursive writing, arithmetic, and an introduction to Biblical principles. The subjects are enhanced by art, music, and computer exposure, creating a clear direction both academically and spiritually.

Elementary Grades - 1-5: We use the A Beka curriculum supplemented with Bob Jones and ACSI. The elementary students gain a broader understanding of science, social studies, English, spelling, math, and Bible. These students are academically challenged for higher level learning. Electives offered on the elementary level are computer, Spanish and library. Elementary students average at least a year above the national average on the Stanford 10. Academic field trips for the elementary grade accent the classroom experience.

Middle School Grades 6-8: At the middle school level, students develop a more disciplined method of study, time management, and individual responsibility. The curriculum is a combination of A Beka, McDougal Littell, Bob Jones and other ACSI supplements. We use the Quest Bible Series which is a fully scoped and sequential Bible curriculum for the middle school grades. This quality curriculum is true to God's Word and applicable to the real issues students face in their everyday lives. Each class is supplemented by electives in Spanish and computers.

High School 9-12: At the high school level, the educational goals include the development of concrete and abstract reasoning skills, communication, and critical thinking skills. We offer two tracks: 1. General Track & 2. College Prep Track (26 credits). The curriculum is a combination of A Beka, McDougal Littell, Bob Jones and other ACSI supplements. We use the Quest Bible Series which is a fully scoped and sequential Bible curriculum for the high school grades. Students are encouraged to apply for Dual Enrollment through the local colleges. We also provide in-house SAT prep seminars to prepare them for the exams. Juniors and Seniors are taken to College Fairs to broaden their vision for their future education. Some students even begin their internship during their senior year in their field of choice.

An excellent computer lab with internet capability and a fully functioning Library are available to each student for research purposes.

What is the Admissions Process at NCS?

We welcome your interest in Norlina Christian School and encourage you to visit, phone, or email us for more information. These are a few recommendations we have to ensure your decision to enroll in our school is right for you and your family.

- Schedule a school visit for you and your child (recommended)
- Request an application packet
- Complete the enrollment application
- Schedule the required testing
- Request a financial aid application

Registration of your student begins with an interview with the appropriate principal and our administrator. It is recommended that you bring a copy of the student's birth certificate, the last report card, most current standardized achievement test scores from the previous school, and a letter of recommendation from your pastor or youth pastor to the interview. The enrollment process continues with filling out the application for admission and submitting any necessary documents mentioned previously in this paragraph. Upon a thorough review the parents will be informed regarding admission status in school. You may call the school office one week after submitting the admission form to check on the status of the application. On acceptance a non-refundable registration fee of \$300 should be submitted for registration along with other necessary obligations as specified by the admissions staff. Students are admitted to NCS without regard to race, color, sex, or national origin.

What are the Athletic opportunities at NCS?

NCS has a fine heritage of 20 years of sports accomplishments and honors. We offer the following sports activities: Boy's Varsity Soccer, Girl's Volleyball, Boy's Basketball, Girl's Basketball, Boy's Baseball, Girl's Softball, and Cheerleading.
